Mr. Gatterman and the board discussed the possible name of a regional trail system as well as ownership and liability issues associated with such a system.

Mr. Gatterman gave a PowerPoint presentation on the Harvey Jones Outlet Reconfiguration project which is close to completion. He covered the project goals with a focus on interagency coordination. He acknowledged the project team which included SSCAFCA, the Nature Conservancy, the City of Rio Rancho, the Village of Corrales, and others. Mr. Gatterman showed the board pictures of the work onsite to date and announced that the ribbon cutting for the project would take place on April 7, 2022, at 10:00 am

He stated there were seven asks in the Resolutions which would be presented to our Federal Legislators in our Annual Report. The seven asks are:

- Funding support from the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) for the construction of dependable access routes adjacent to our major arroyos.
- Reauthorization of funding for Section 593.
- Funding support from USCACE Section 593 or Section 595 for the Barrancas Arroyo
- Funding support from USACE Section 593 or Section 595 for Lisbon Channel Phase 3 project from Southern Boulevard to Tarpon Road in the Black Arroyo watershed.
- Funding support from USACE Section 593 or Section 595 for the construction of Riparia Pond.
- Funding support from FEMA Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) to perform a preliminary engineering report and final construction design for identified flooding issues in the City of Rio Rancho in the Nightglow Avenue vicinity
- Funding support for the acquisition of real property adjacent to our active arroyos as a method of flood mitigation and conservation of critical habitat.
